# <u>Kid's Home</u>







**History:** The Kid's Home was started in May of 1978 by Reverend Mindi Esau and his wife. They prayed for a year for the Lord's guidance concerning the home. Since the death of Esau, his son, Mindi Jesse Ratna Kumar, and his wife, Mary Sunita, have directed the home. Jesse was trained for this job by helping his father as he has been involved since its

beginning. This home has brought hundreds of souls to the feet of our Lord Jesus Christ. Some of the children who have grown up in the home are now teachers, preachers, evangelists, pastors, postmen, and

executives with good reputations. The children come to the home with their Hindu backgrounds, but when they leave the home, they carry the name of Jesus written on their hearts. Since the home opened, it has cared for over 850 children in the love of Jesus.

**Program:** The home is located in the city of Visakhapatnam, in the state of Andhra Pradesh. As the city has grown, the home has been surrounded on all sides by tall buildings and there is no longer a place to



play. The children come to the home around the age of five, when they are in the first grade, and stay until they finish the 10th grade, which is the completion of high school in India. When they leave, the home tries to help them find employment and supports them until they can support themselves. After they leave the



program, they often call or come back to visit. The children walk to a private Christian school about 2 km. from the home. At the home, the children enjoy playing carom and other board games, ring toss, and they like to go to the beach or visit historical sights. They have morning and evening devotions, they go to Thursday night Child Evangelism Fellowship, and on Sunday they go to church for worship, and Sunday School. There are many evangelists that come to the home to share in the devotions and sing with the children.
