Our trip to India and the COPI conference (September 10 –18, 2011) was such a joy as we fellowshipped with representatives from all fourteen homes. Relationship building was a vision the Lord gave us even before we left home. God's principle works: communication results in relationships which results in ministry to one another. This was a trip without predesigned purpose with an open spirit to revelation. The ministry of our brothers and sisters in India to us was that of example. This could be summed up in two words-- humility and sincerity.

It was prudent to look at the situation of diminishing funds due to economic conditions and an aging donor base. This lead to mutual praise of our Lord! For despite conditions, He has sustained this work in India. This is truly about hearts and is a praise item. We still struggle with the unending needs in the India homes. It is only when we look to the Lord Jesus as our resource that we have peace. How blessed we are that COPI house parents on the front line have grasped this truth. Yes, they do look forward to the distribution of funds from COPI every month, but in a spirit of learning and training, they are seeing other ways that the Lord is supplying. They shared stories of friends and relatives, particularly in foreign countries, helping. Also there were increased gardens, and in one case two truckloads of coconuts from the property that sold for a considerable sum. This new view point is resulting in a unity of spirit among house parents that is necessary in a broken world.

How blessed we all are to have this unity of spirit among sponsors, house parents, and COPI volunteers: that life is all about Jesus. Please pray with us that these children will understand the true message of the Gospel. They do go to church, memorize scripture, and pray together, but we so want them to be walking in the spirit, trusting God, knowing that Jesus is their friend and Savior.

We must continue one day at a time, doing all we can in the Lord's strength, being sure that we are listening to the Master's voice. Obedience is the answer to the future.
